Find a CSS generator and explain the pros and cons:

Pro:

One of my favorite CSS3 generators is the [Ultimate CSS Gradient Generator](#) by Colorzilla. I like the WYSIWYG editor that offers preset selections with options to let you modify your gradient and save it for use later. Four options: hue/saturation, reverse, import CSS, and import image offer advanced features. There are five orientation options and five color options to select from as well. You can add an Internet Explorer fix and have comments put in your code.

Con:

By using this application, you have one more step beyond Adobe that takes up your valuable time and may make it not worth the hassle. There is a size limitation of 370 px X 50 px which is very limiting. The abundance of code you have to cut and paste can seem overwhelming but that is just the way it is.

Final:

I still use the generator sometime but with the constant improvements in Dreamweaver I believe I will use it less and less.
